KEY FINDINGS

QUALITY

- 47% of CPS elementary students who live in the region attend a Level 1+/1 school and 44% of CPS high school students attend a Level 1+/1 high school.
- 28% of African American students attend a Level 2 school, compared to 19% of Hispanic students.
- There are 73 schools, 29 of which are Level 1+/1. 16 are Level 2+, 24 are Level 2, and 2 are Level 3.
- There are almost 10,000 unfilled Level 1+/1 elementary seats and 72 unfilled Level 1+/1 high school seats.
- 100% of Level 1+/1 elementary seats have no admissions criteria, and 79% are at attendance area schools. Of Level 1+/1 high school seats, 52% have admissions criteria and 48% have some programs with criteria.

QUANTITY

- The CPS population in the region has dropped by 8.7% (about 3,600 students) since the 2014-2015 school year, which is greater than the citywide decline of 6.0%.
- Enrollment in schools in the region has dropped even more (over 5,100 students, or 14.2%).
- There are 28,841 more seats than students enrolled in the region.

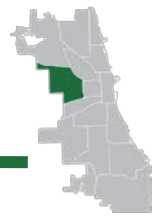
CHOICE

- 20% of CPS elementary students and 51% of CPS high school students choose to attend school outside of their region. 39% of CPS elementary students and 9% of CPS high school students attend their zoned school.
- Of CPS elementary students who choose not to attend their zoned school, 28% travel under one mile. Of CPS high school students who choose not to attend their zoned school, 51% travel over three miles and 18% travel over six miles.

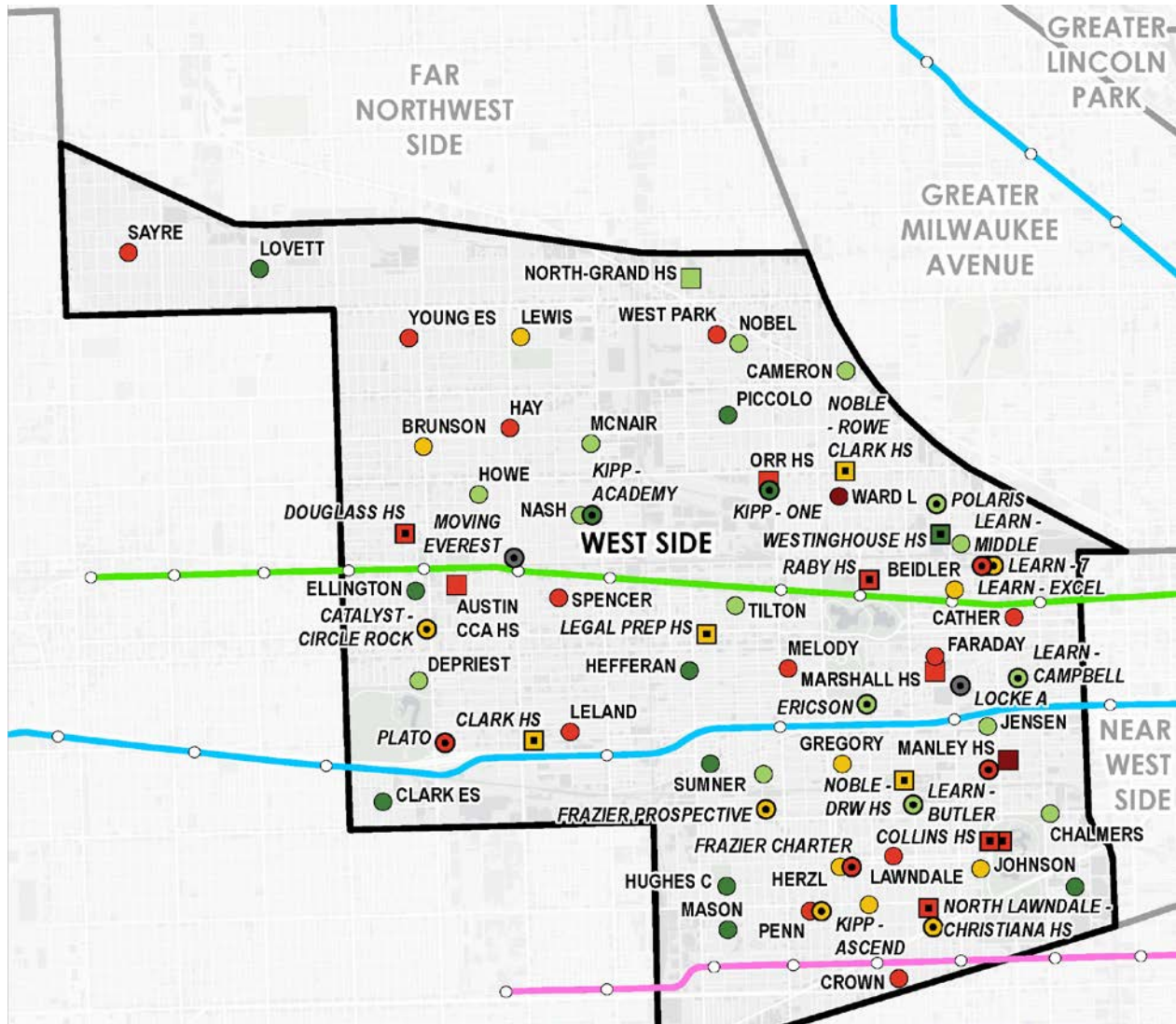
VARIETY

- The region lacks an Academic Center or Regional Gifted Center/Classical option for elementary students.
- For high schoolers, there is no Fine and Performing Arts option in the region.

The West Side Planning Area is bounded generally by W Addison St to the north, W Grand Ave to the south, the METRA Union Pacific Northwest railroad line to the east and the METRA Milwaukee District/North Line tracks to the west. It contains parts of 11 wards, 19 neighborhoods, and five community areas. The region is home to 229,000 residents and has the fourth largest population of all the regions. It is served by 11 CTA train stops and six METRA stops.

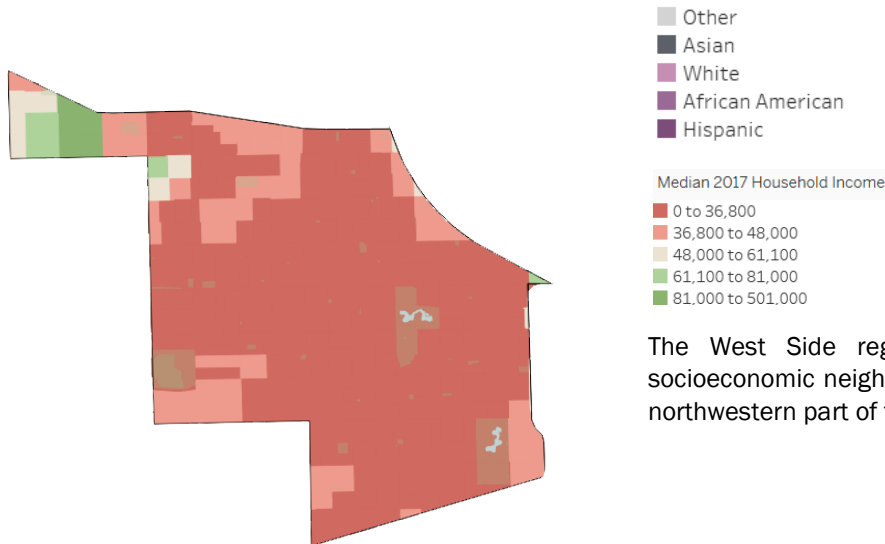
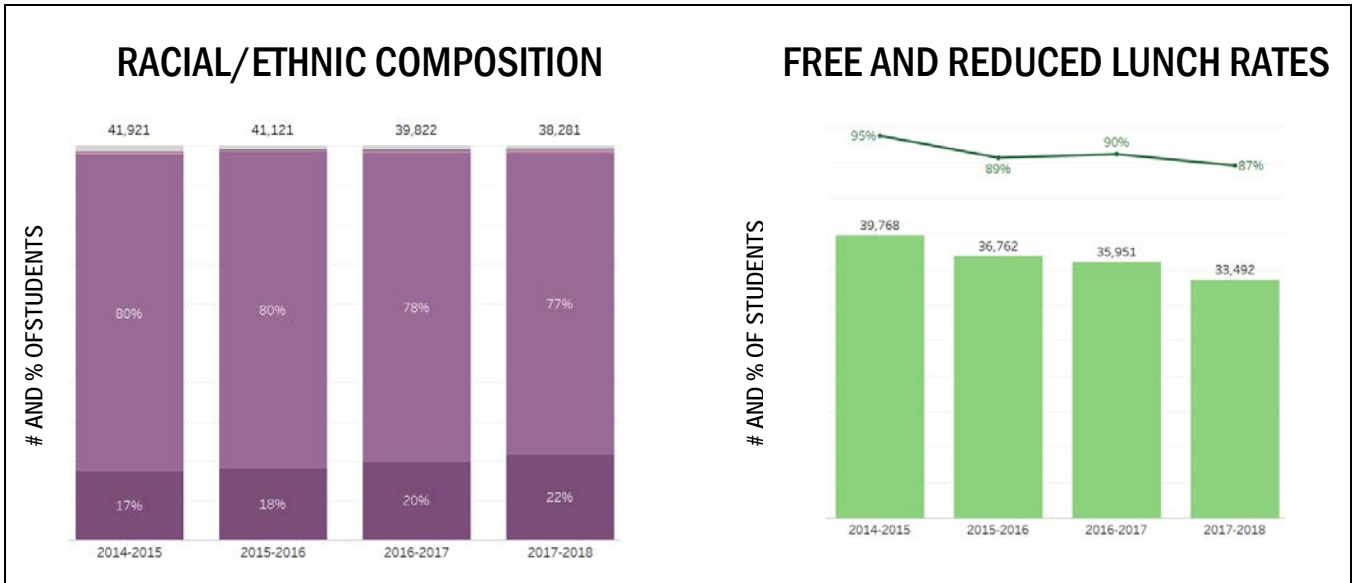


DEMOGRAPHIC COMPOSITION

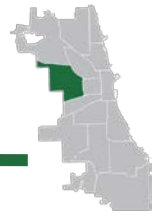
The West Side region has become less African American and more Hispanic.

The racial/ethnic composition of the West Side CPS population is majority African American, although in the past four years the share of African American students has dropped from 80% to 77% as the percentage of

Hispanic students has risen from 17% to 22%. The percentage of students qualified for FRL has dropped from 95% to 87% in the past four years, which is higher than the district average.



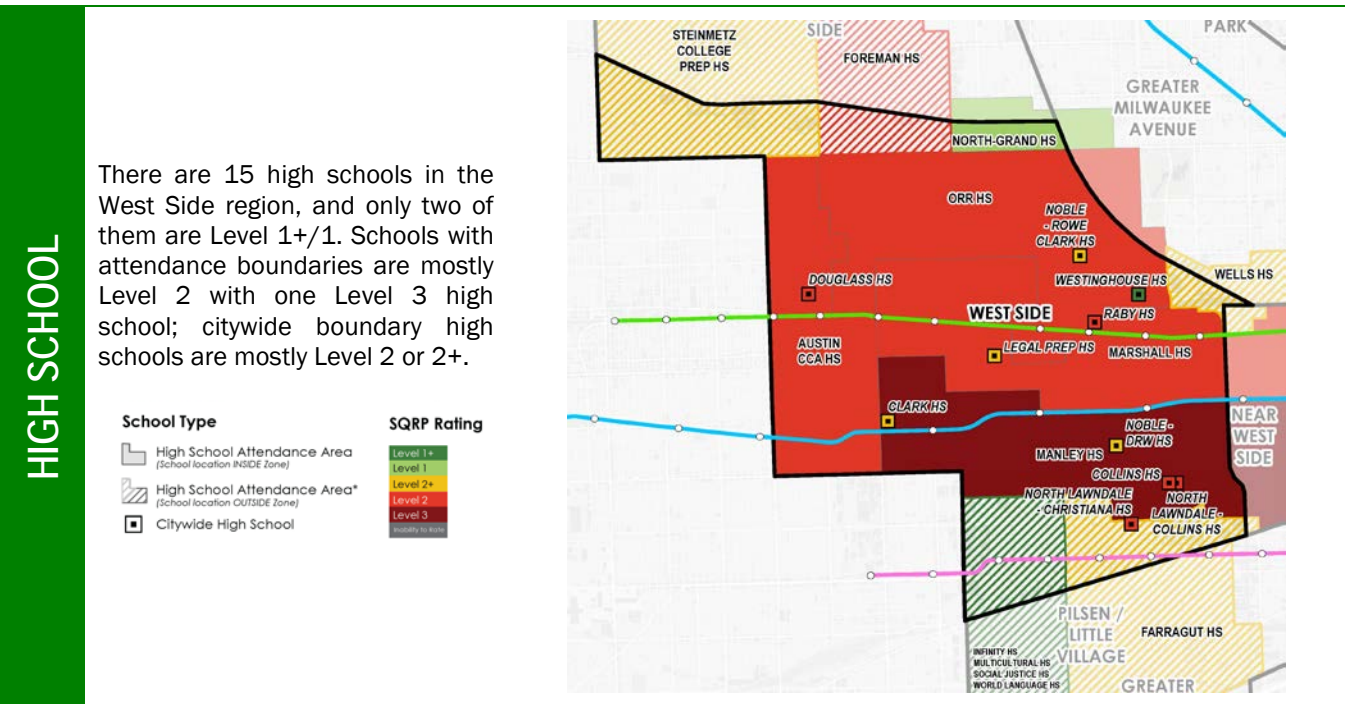
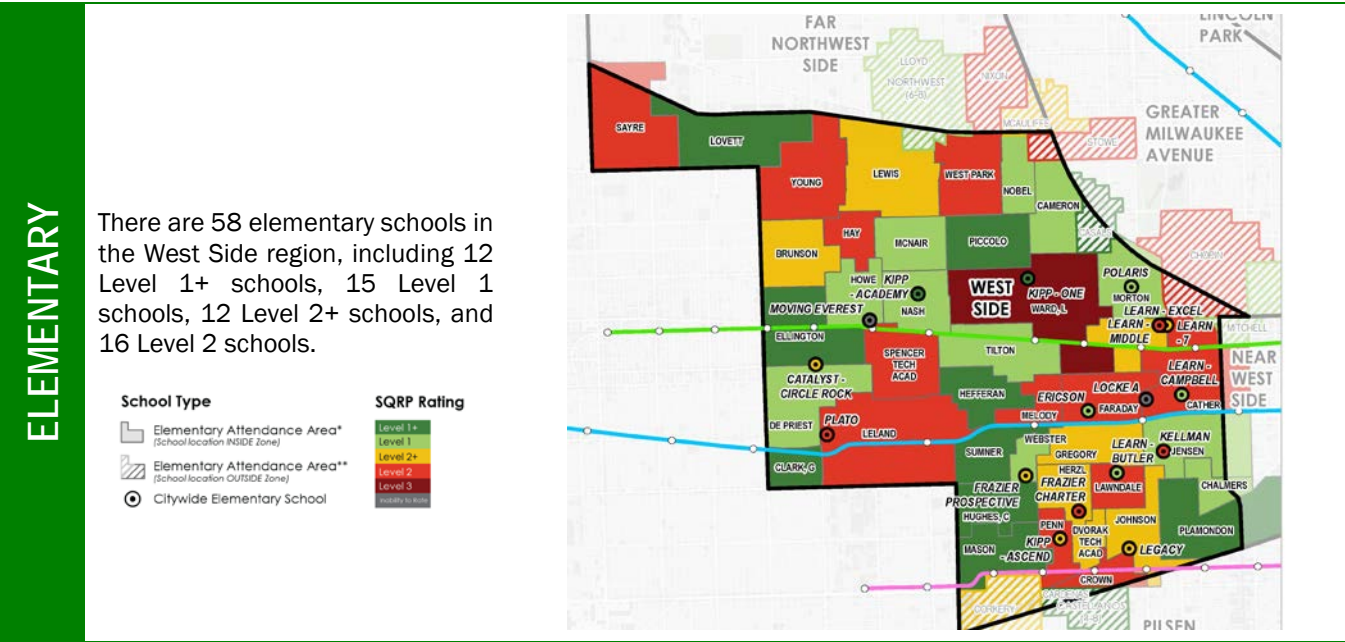
The West Side region is primarily made up of low socioeconomic neighborhoods, with a wealthier area in the northwestern part of the region in the Galewood area.

School attendance boundary view shows school quality disparities within the region.

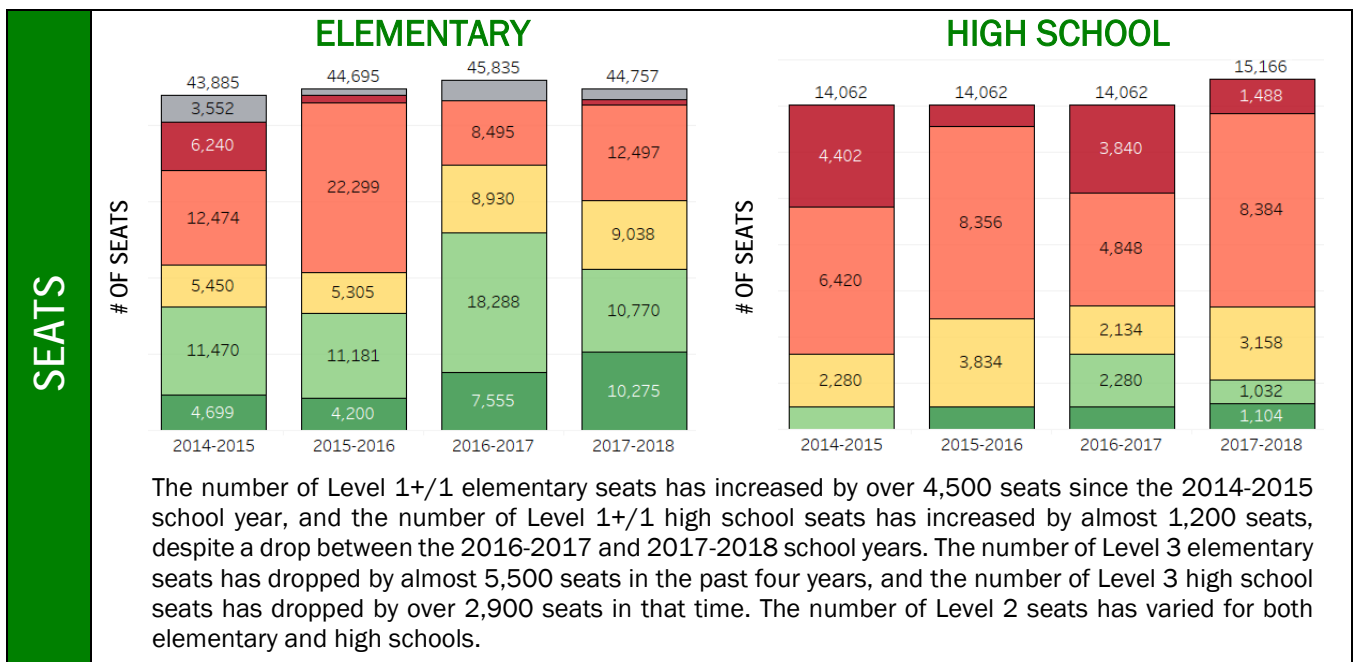
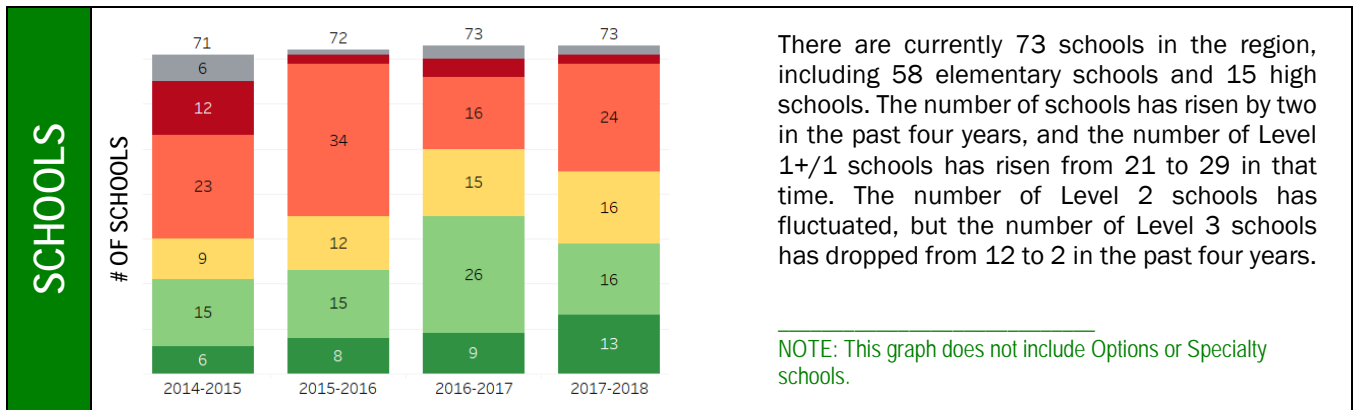

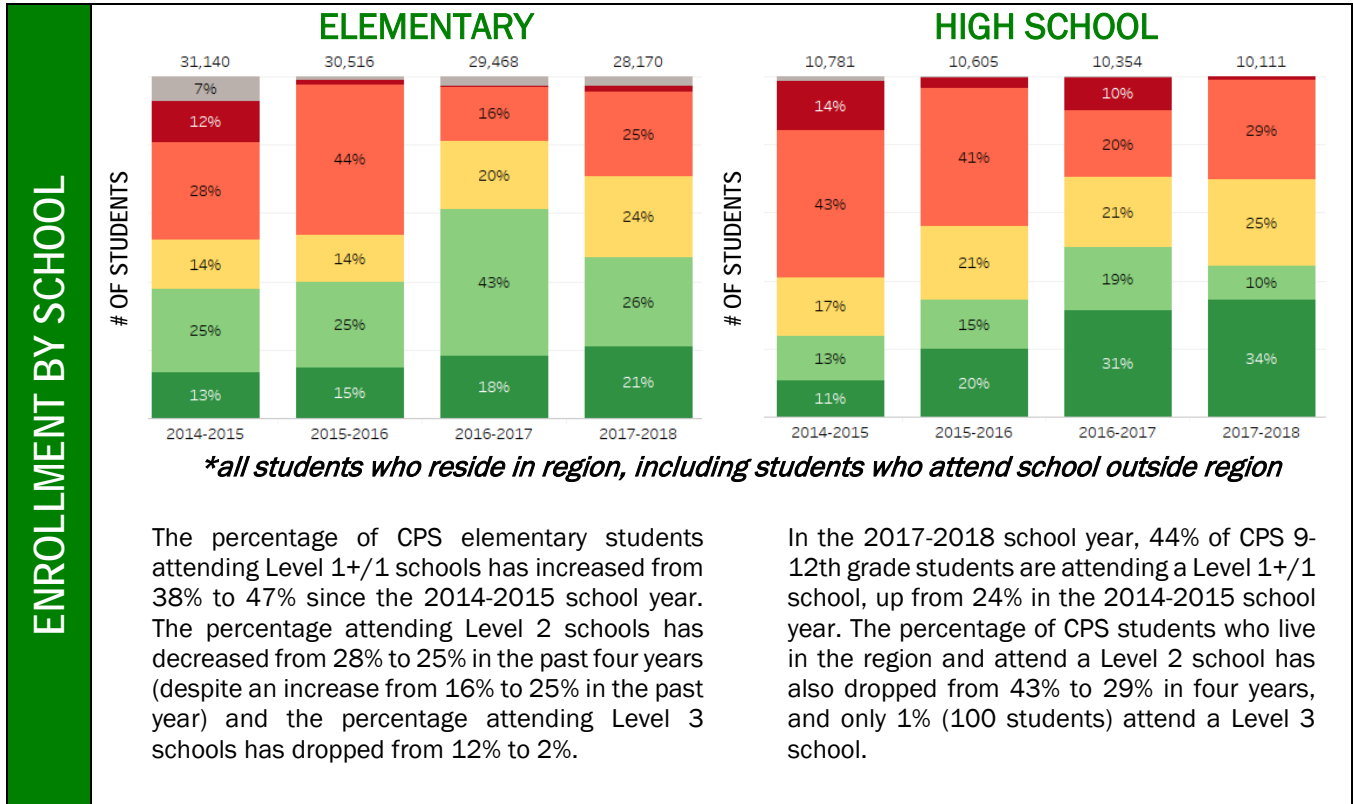

There is increased enrollment in Level 1+/1 schools, despite a dip in the past year.



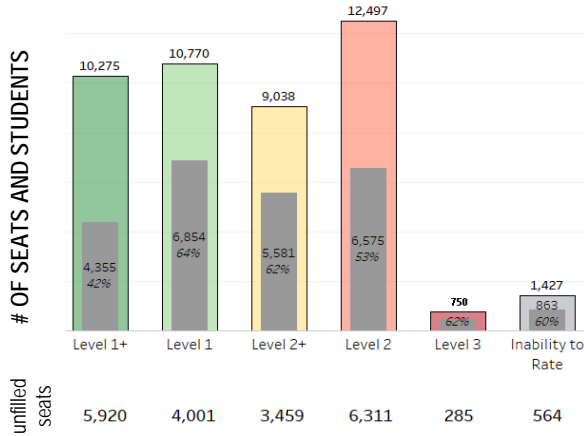

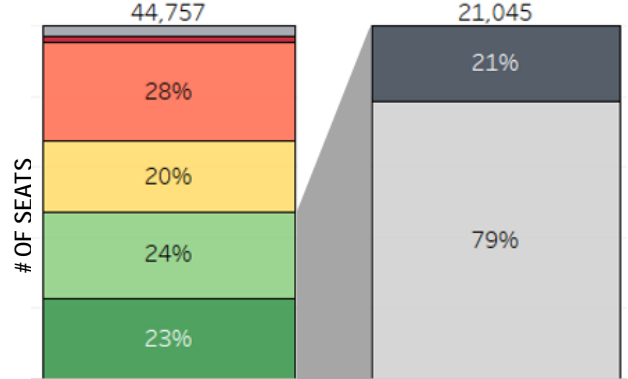

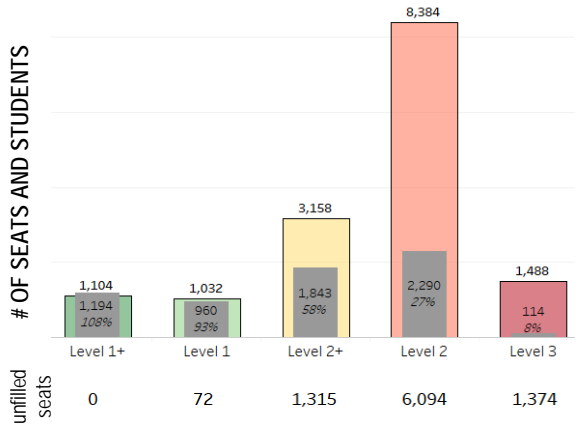
ADMISSION TYPE OF LEVEL 1+/1 SCHOOLS



Of all Level 1+/1 seats in the region, 79% are at attendance area schools with no admissions criteria, and the other 21% are at citywide schools with no admissions criteria.

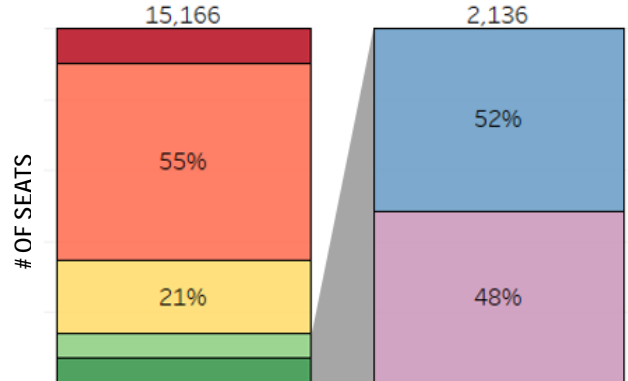

5,630 high school students who live in the region do not attend a Level 1+/1 school (see previous page). There are 72 unfilled Level 1 seats.

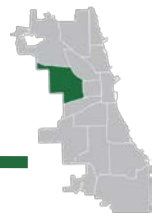
ADMISSION TYPE OF LEVEL 1+/1 SCHOOLS



Of all Level 1+/1 seats in the region, 48% are at attendance boundary schools that have some programs with admissions criteria. The other 52% are at citywide schools that have both a geographic preference area *and* admissions criteria.

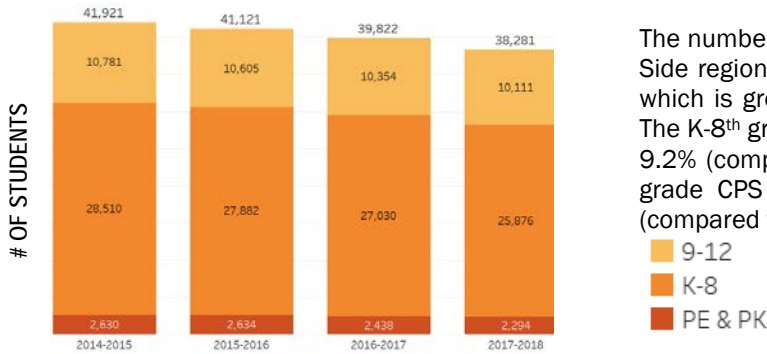

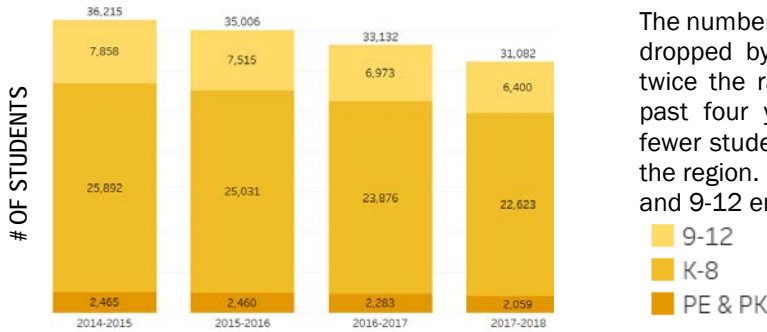

The number of CPS students who live in the West Side region has dropped by about 3,600 (8.7%), which is greater than the 6.0% citywide decline. The K-8th grade CPS population has decreased by 9.2% (compared to district 6.4%) and the 9-12th grade CPS population has decreased by 6.2% (compared to district 3.1%).

CPS ENROLLMENT

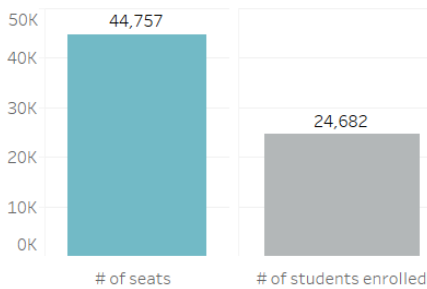
students who attend school in region, including those who reside out of region



The number of students enrolled in the region has dropped by over 5,100 students (14.2%), over twice the rate of change of population. For the past four years, there have consistently been fewer students enrolled in the region than live in the region. K-8 enrollment has dropped by 12.6% and 9-12 enrollment has decreased by 18.6%.

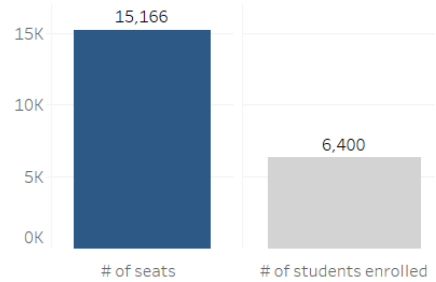

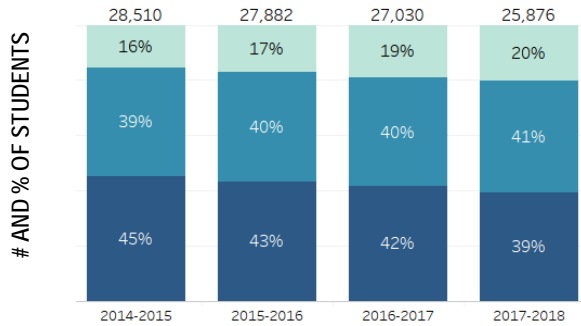

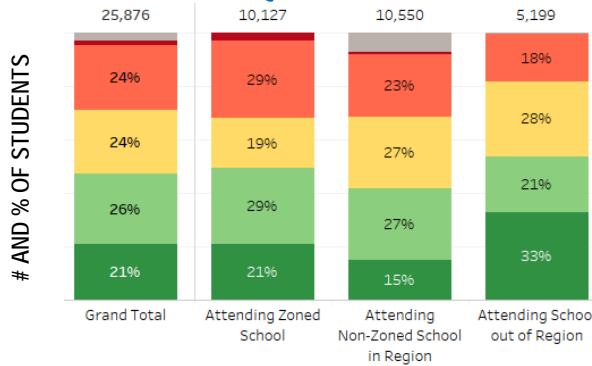
SCHOOL CHOICE OVER TIME



School choice is currently defined as attending a school that is not a student's zoned school. School choice among CPS elementary school students has increased moderately in the West Side region. The percentage of students attending their zoned school has fallen from 45% to 39% and the percentage attending school out of the region has increased from 16% to 20%.

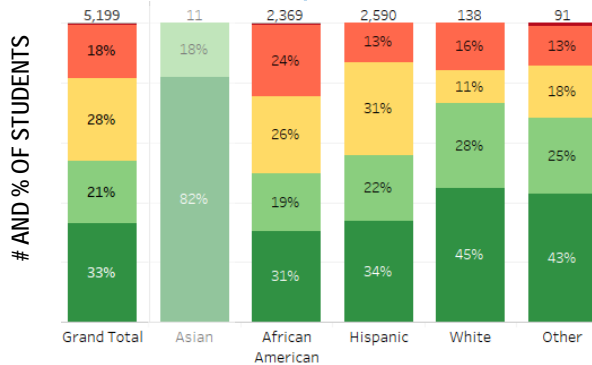

SCHOOL QUALITY AND CHOICE



Of the 25,876 CPS elementary students residing in the West Side region, 47% attend a Level 1+/1 school. This is relatively constant by school choice. 50% of students who attend their zoned school go to a Level 1+/1 school; for students who attend a non-zoned school in the West Side region, that number falls to 42%; and for students who leave the region school, that number is 54%.

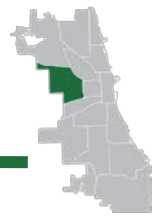
STUDENTS WHO ATTEND SCHOOL OUT OF REGION – RACIAL/ETHNIC BREAKDOWN



Of the 5,199 CPS students who attend school out of the region (see above), most are African American or Hispanic. African American and Hispanic attend Level 1+/1 schools at similar rates. However, 24% of African American students attend a Level 2 school, compared to 13% of Hispanic students.

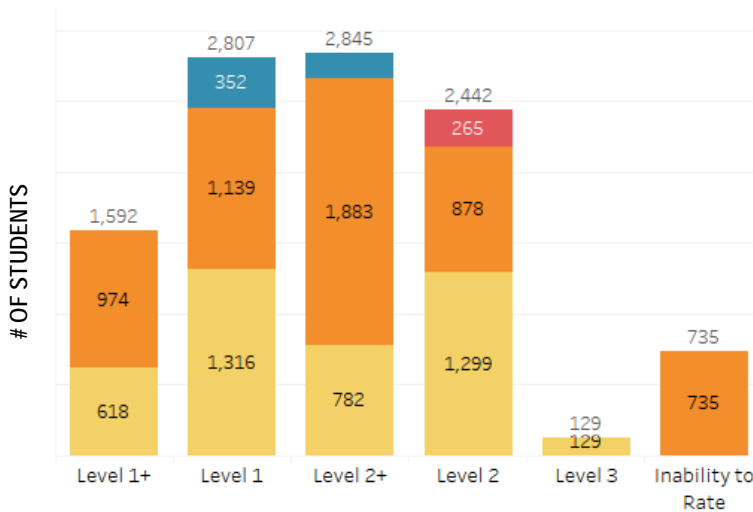

STUDENTS WHO ATTEND NON-ZONED SCHOOL IN REGION

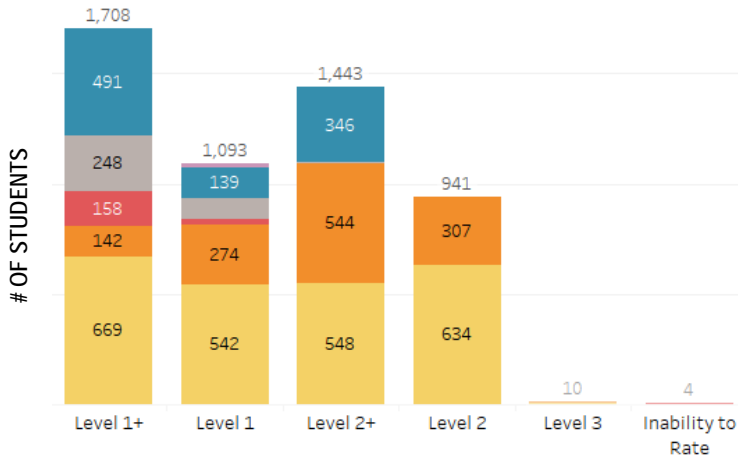


Of the 41% of CPS elementary students who attend a non-zoned school in the region (see previous page), most students are spread evenly across Level 1 and Level 2 schools. The majority of students attend charter/contract schools; most of the rest attend attendance boundary schools.

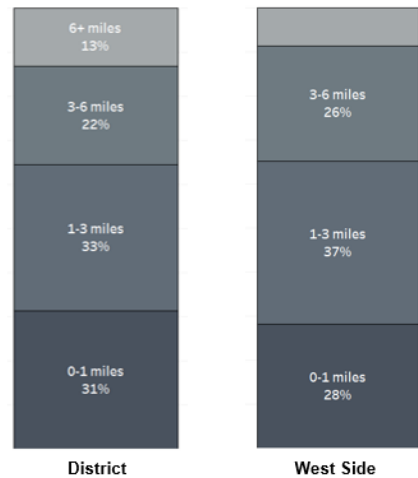
Of the 20% who go outside the region (see previous page), most students are evenly spread across Level 1+, 1, and 2 schools; many go to boundary schools, charter schools, or magnet schools.

Of students who do not attend their zoned school, 28% stay within one mile of their home and 35% travel over three miles.

STUDENTS WHO ATTEND NON-ZONED SCHOOL OUT OF REGION

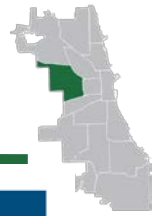


DISTANCE TRAVELED FOR STUDENTS NOT ATTENDING ZONED SCHOOL



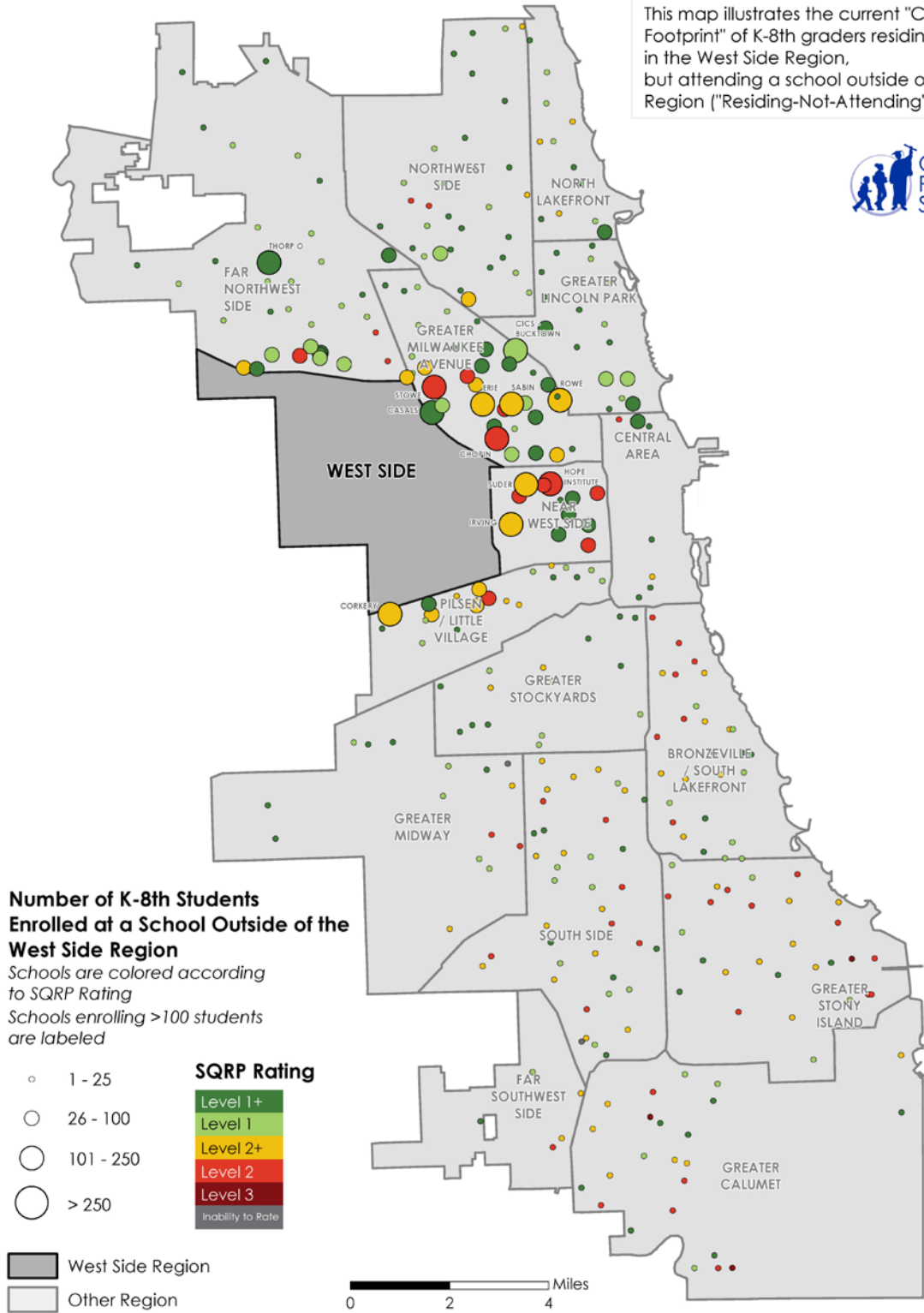

This map illustrates the current "Choice Footprint" of K-8th graders residing in the West Side Region, but attending a school outside of this Region ("Residing-Not-Attending")

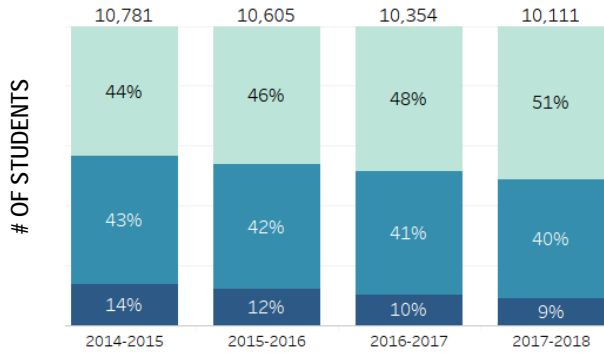

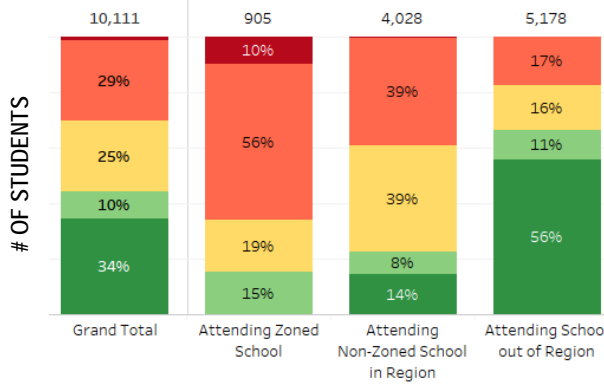
SCHOOL CHOICE OVER TIME



School choice is currently defined as attending a school that is not a student's zoned school. School choice in the West Side region has increased moderately among CPS high school students. The percentage of high school students attending their zoned school has dropped from 14% to 9% in four years, and the percentage leaving the region has risen from 44% to 51%.

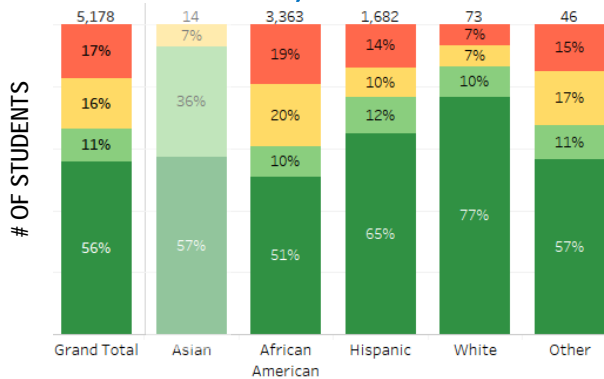

QUALITY BY SCHOOL CHOICE



Of the 10,111 CPS high school students residing in the region, 44% attend a Level 1+/1 school. This varies moderately by school choice. For students attending school out of the region, 67% attend a Level 1+/1 school; for students attending a non-zoned school in the region, that number is only 22%. No students attending their zoned school attend a Level 1+ school and 15% attend a Level 1 school.

STUDENTS WHO ATTEND SCHOOL OUT OF REGION - RACIAL/ETHNIC BREAKDOWN



Of the 5,178 CPS students who attend school out of the region (see above), most are African American or Hispanic. African American students attend Level 1+/1 schools at a lower rate than Hispanic students – 61% compared to 77%. They also attend Level 2 schools at a higher rate – 20% compared to 14%.

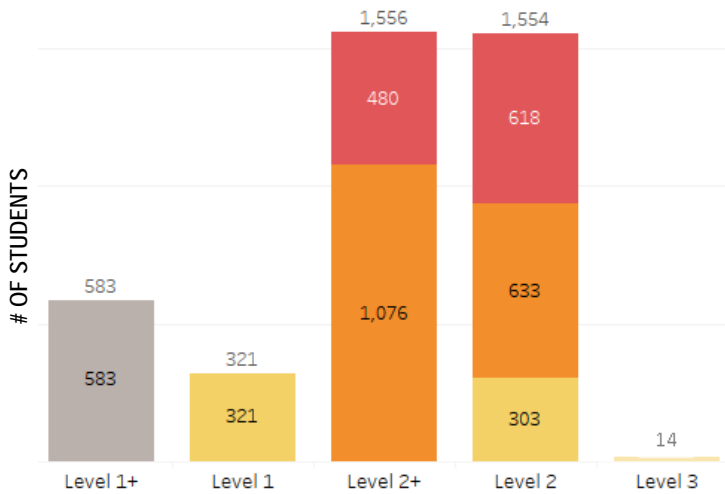

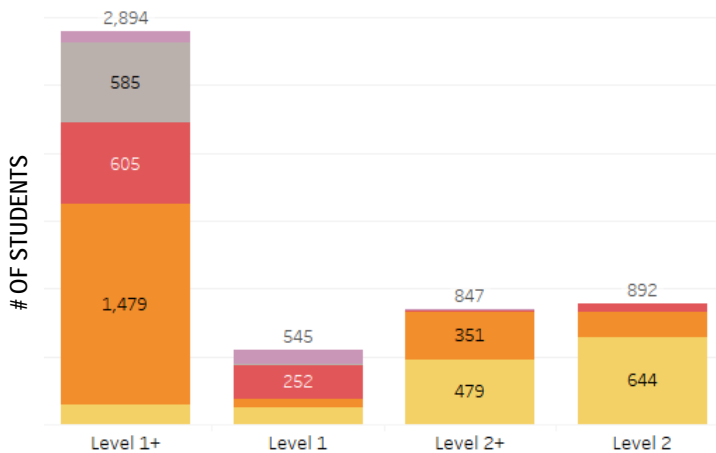


Of the 40% of CPS high schoolers attending a non-zoned school in the region (see previous page), the vast majority attend a Level 2+/2 school, most of which are charter/contract or citywide schools. 583 attend a Level 1+ school; they are all selective enrollment schools.

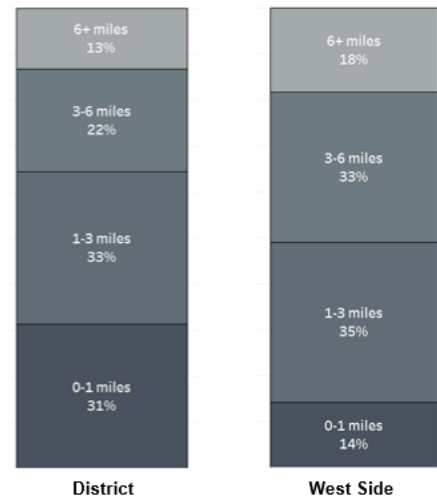
Of the 51% who attend school outside of the region (see previous page), over half attend Level 1+ schools. Most of these schools are contract/charter schools; many are also citywide or selective enrollment schools.

Of students who do not attend their zoned school, 51% travel over three miles for school and 18% travel over six miles.

STUDENTS WHO ATTEND NON-ZONED SCHOOL OUT OF REGION

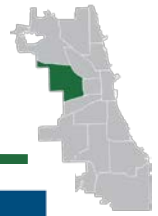


DISTANCE TRAVELED TO SCHOOL IF NOT ATTENDING ZONED SCHOOL



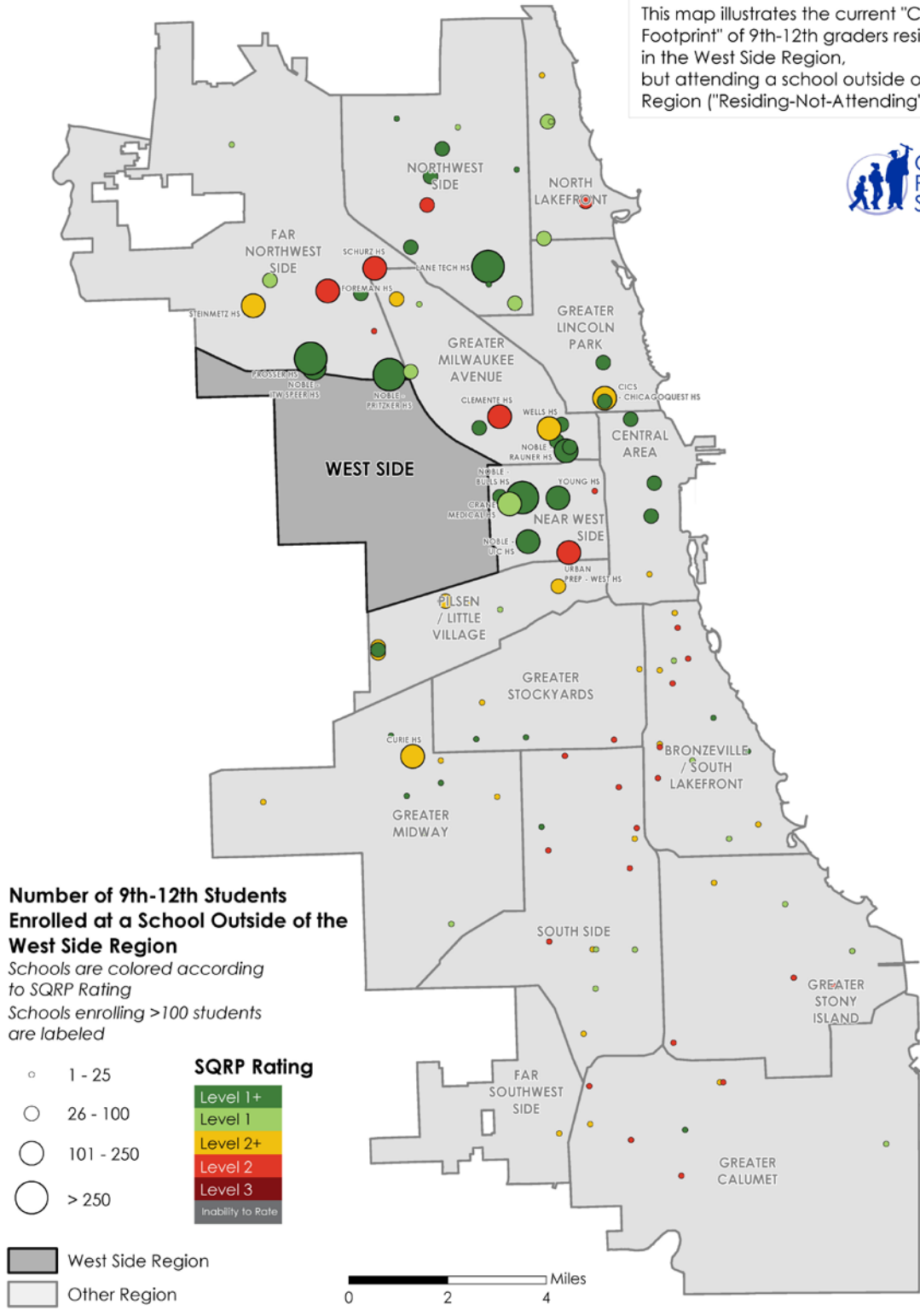

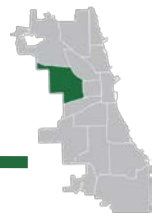
